



THE APPROPRIATE DRESS CODE FOR THE AOBFP PRACTICAL OMT EXAMINATION IS AS FOLLOWS:

Recommended Dress:

- Khaki or dress, leg-length pants (should be able to pull pant leg up to the knee)
- Collared, button-down, or conservative shirt
- Shirts are to be loose enough to show the top of the neckline, elbows, forearms and hands
- Closed-toe, low heel shoes with nylons or socks (all easily removable)

Candidates will *not* be admitted into the examination room if wearing any of the following:

Watches	Hospital/surgical scrubs	Athletic pants/shorts
Jeans/denim pants	Jackets/coats	Athletic shoes
Long neck ties/bow ties	Halter/tube tops	Bathing suits
Scarves	Skirts/dresses above the knee	Sandals/flip flops
Hats/visors	Sweaters/sweatshirts	High heel shoes
Dangle/large hoop earrings	Tank tops/T-shirts	Any visible undergarments

Candidates that do not adhere to the dress code will not be admitted into the examination room and asked to return in proper attire at a new time assignment (pending availability).

Participation in the AOBFP OMT Practical Examination requires candidates comply with the appropriate dress code as stated below. Any candidate who does not comply with the dress code will not be allowed to sit for the OMT Practical Examination.
