EXAM CONDUCT

Upon entering the room, please notify the concierge immediately if you recognize any of the examiners. The examiner(s) will be replaced prior to the start of the examination.

There may be a delay to starting after entering each room. This provides time to reassign examiners or candidates if there is a conflict. Our goal is to keep this time under 5 minutes.

If the question has images, the concierge will have control of the images. If you would like to see an image after it has been taken off the screen, please inform the examiner which image. The examiner will then communicate to the concierge which image to display.

You will have 17 minutes to complete each oral case. You will receive an alert from the concierge when there are 3 minutes remaining in the question. If you finish prior to the 17-minute limit, the exam will not move forward. There will be silence until the 17-minute time limit is reached. Once you have finished answering the question, please click on the let the concierge and examiners know that you have completed the question, even if it is prior to the 17 minutes allotted. The Examiner will have 5 minutes to score the exam after the 17 minutes have lapsed. The examiner will turn off their audio and video feed during the scoring process. You will then proceed with the second and third questions in a similar manner.

Three questions will be administered in the first room. After the 3rd question, you will be placed in the virtual waiting area and subsequently be assigned to your second room. Upon entering the room, please notify the concierge immediately if you recognize any of the examiners. The examiner(s) will be replaced prior to the start of the examination. You will have three questions in the second room.

Once you have completed the 6th question, your will be placed in the virtual waiting area. Your examination is complete, but you must remain in the room until released by staff.
